

CLASSROOM NEWS


Amy's Class

We are so happy to be back and getting into a new routine! We have many new students to our class and have been busy getting to know everyone and reacquaint ourselves with returning students. Over the next couple of months, we look forward to diving into our Math Up activities for learning mathematic concepts through games! We will also be focusing our artwork on different sensory crafts that include all 5 senses: touch, see, smell, hear, and taste. We are excited to get busy learning this new school year!



Breton's Class

We have had a great start to the school year! We welcomed four new friends to our classroom; Ethan, Jessica, Dimitra and Chloe! We have focused on back to school routines and have been doing an activity on school sounds. Students have been using switches and the smart board to turn the pages and hear familiar and some new school sounds. Then students told us whether they liked the sounds and we are charting our responses and making a graph. We have also been reading the book *Pete the Cat: Rocking in my School Shoes*. Music class has been a blast so far with students playing new instruments like the chimes and steel tongue drum. We have been dancing with scarves to the song "Let it Go", and learning the chicken dance. We are looking forward to learning about Earth Sciences and Energy in the upcoming months.



Colleen's Class

Welcome back! We've enjoyed a great start to what is sure to be a fun and successful year. We are happy to have returning classmates Cohen, Sukhraj, Charlie and Richard in the class this year, and are welcoming Kailani, Aria and Messiah to join us. We have taken time to enjoy the continued sunshine while we focus intently on the mathematical

strand of measurement. Specific attention has been given to building measurement vocabulary; finding appropriate terms on devices and in PODD books, and terms that mean similar concepts. We have measured the lengths of names by both counting letters and comparing non-standard tiling units to make posters and have been surprised when comparing and ordering visual representation of our heights. Wow these kids are growing tall! Looking forward to the fall, we will take advantage of the good weather and use some community walks to supplement a learning unit on Community and Safety.



Darcy's Class

We have had a quick transition into our new year of learning and growing. We eased into routine the first couple of weeks and are now settling nicely in to our first unit of study. We are busy investigating oceans and the habitats within. This incredible group of kiddos is also enjoying our first novel Read Aloud. We started to read *The One and Only Ivan* by Katherine Applegate. This novel is a recommended read for Grade ¾ and will take us some time to get through. The kids are already learning so much about compassion, captivity vs wild, and friendship. We have had some great laughs and a few tears. This read is also reminding us about the things good readers do: make pictures in their heads, make predictions, think about the characters, figure out what words mean, and so much more. In math, we are beginning with the curricular link: "Quantity is measured with numbers that enable counting, labelling, comparing, and operating." We have been grouping and adding groups together as well as counting to twenty, and tracking the number of days we are in school. Our literacy focus is



currently upon a review of the sound wall and the letters and letter groups that make each sound. We are looking forward to many science and art activities to support our learning and to help us make connections between our learning and what is happening in the world around us.


